

Curriculum and Subjects

- Children are taught mainly by their form teacher in their class base, they will move around for some subjects DT, Art, Music etc.
- Subjects include: English, Maths, Science, History, R.S. Geography, French, Spanish, Art/DT, Music, P.E. and Games.
- Matches and Tournaments- Thursdays and occasionally at the weekend.
- Sports covered include: Rugby, Netball, Football, Hockey, Cricket, Rounders, Athletics, Tennis and Basketball, handball and gymnastics multi-sports also.
