Academic

Setting/Assessment Tests

- Setting is recommended by the Year 3 staff.
- There are usually 3 Sets (1, 2 & 3)
- Monitored and reviewed regularly by DH - Academic/English and Maths staff
- Fluid system, movement possible
- End of topic tests/regular spelling etc./reading
- Assessments - PTE/PTM/CATs
- Reporting to parents - written format and Parent evenings throughout the year - notification sent - booking of appointments etc



Preps

- Your child should have prep in some form every night
- The staff set preps that should be completed within 15 minutes in Year 4
- Some evenings you may have 2 preps, one of which may be a learning prep - French vocab/Reading etc
- Prep at school is supervised BUT it is not assisted
- Preps will be detailed in the prep diary/MSP
- The above information will be confirmed at the start of the year in the children's prep diaries

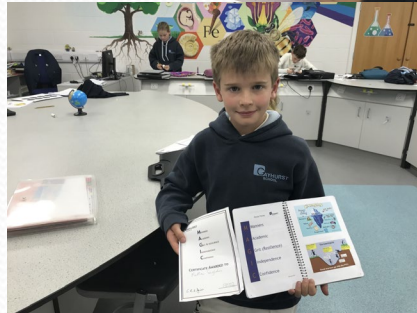
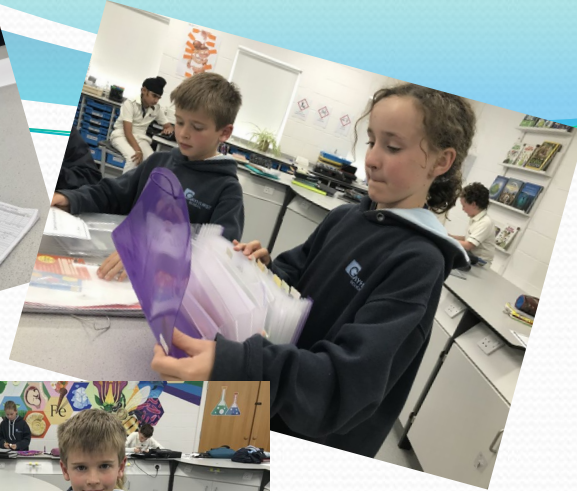
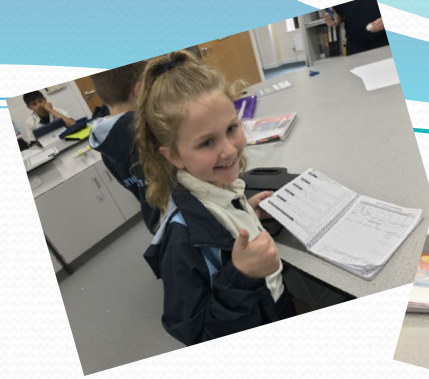
Organisation!

One of the main differences the children notice in Year 4 is the increased movement around the school.

To aid this process, the children use an EXPANDABLE file that has sections labelled with subject headings.

In order to manage this successfully we recommend one or two things!

- Regularly checking your child's diary - annotating once a week, daily for preps
- Having a copy of your child's timetable up in the house to make it easier for them to check what they need for the day ahead when packing their school bag the night before.



Food.....

- Snacks – Morning and Afternoon
- Lunches – canteen style

Now What?



- On Wednesday 22nd June 2022 - there will be a 30 minute Q & A session for parents with Miss Legg, Assistant Head - Senior School, and the Year 4 Team- this will be on MS Teams - a link will be sent to you in advance.
- At the start of July, the children will get to know which form they will be in next year and have their 'Moving Up' time.
- The Year 4 staff will visit the Year 3 children in their Year 3 classes before the end of term although they are already very familiar with the children, having taught them in Year 3
- The Year 3 & 4 staff will complete a detailed handover session before the end of term
- Children who are NEW to the school will be invited into school at the end of August to meet their Form Teacher again
- During the holidays - parents will be sent a copy of the Parent Handbook for 2022-2023
